The Select Board was in receipt of a Special Event Application modified as a result of a typographical error to Saturday, September 30, 2023 from 1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. at the Mashpee Rotary.

The Orange Shirt Day event is being sponsored by the Mashpee Wampanoag Tribe as a National Day for Truth and Reconciliation. Joanne Frye is the primary contact. Orange flags and banners are planned to be installed within the inner portion of the rotary circle effective September 15-30, 2023. On the official day, September 30, 2023, the OVC Division of the Mashpee Wampanoag Tribal Homeland Security Police Department and participants (open to the public) will stand around the rotary holding positive posters and flags in support of Orange Shirt Day.

This event will honor the 215+ Native American Children that have died in Residential (boarding) Schools and the unmarked graves of some of the children. This is a positive non-violent event estimating about 60-100 participants. There will be speakers and drumming.

Applicable regulatory agencies have signed off on the Special Events Application with stipulations imposed by the Department of Public Works. It was agreed this is an important day for the entire community raising awareness, remembrance and honoring the Indigenous children forced into these schools. School children will be encouraged to wear orange shirts.

LIAISON REPORTS

<u>Chamber of Commerce:</u> The annual Christmas Parade is scheduled to be held on December 9, 2023. The Chamber is conducting public outreach for new ideas to improve this event to showcase the community.

WATER QUALITY UPDATES

The Town of Mashpee is working with the Town's of Sandwich and Barnstable on the shared Municipal Watershed Agreement. This may represent additional funding opportunities for Mashpee.

The Cape Cod & Islands Water Protection Fund board is working diligently to secure the 25% subsidy funding from the State, a critical funding source to assist towns in the clean-up of coastal waterways and embayment's. Many Cape towns have submitted letters in support including the Assembly of Delegates.

Cape Cod Aquifund is offering zero to low interest betterment loans tiered at 0%, 2%, and 4% based on income for new sewer connections.

The Cape Cod Commission has just released the new flood area guidelines.

The Environmental Oversight Committee meeting was comprehensive having presentations by the APCC and NOAH as well as the Directors of Natural Resources from the Town and Tribe discussing matters of importance was well as collaboration efforts to advance funding opportunities for clean water. A slide presentation will be shared with the full Select Board.

It was noted the Town and Tribe have been working closely monitoring the various water bodies in Mashpee as well as seeking ways to improve water quality with stormwater management and other projects. Mutual initiatives include but are not limited to, climate adaptation, and habitat restoration in coastal areas. For efficiency and effectiveness collaboration is highly regarded.

All Cape towns have water quality concerns. Working closely with the neighboring towns will bring forth progress, but it will take time.

Recommendation for Award – DPW Roof Improvements

The Town received four bids in response to the RFB issued for restoration of the membrane roof at DPW. Attached are the results. Funding for the project was approved through CIP at the May Town Meeting. All bids were well within the budgeted amount.

I recommend that a contract be awarded to **Gibson Roofs, Inc.** in the amount of **\$169,000**. Gibson Roofs is the lowest, qualified bidder. (JAG Painting Contractors was disqualified as they did not submit the required bid bond.)

Gibson Roofs has successfully completed a number of similar projects in other municipalities in Massachusetts, including the membrane roof at the Quashnet School roof as part of the larger renovation project for that school. They are currently DCAM certified for roofing work with an average rating of 92.

Gibson Roofs understands the time sensitivity for the project due to weather/temperature restrictions and are prepared to undertake the project within the required schedule.

Recommendation for Award – Design/Engineering for KC Coombs School

Ventilation and Air Conditioning Improvements

The Town received proposals from five firms for the design and engineering of ventilation and air conditioning improvements at the KC Coombs School. Attached are the list of proposers. Funding for the project was approved through CIP at the May Town Meeting.

The Selection Committee reviewed the proposals received and found that three met the minimum criteria. The Committee then reviewed these three based on the Comparative Evaluation Criteria.

As the Committee was unable to finalize a recommendation after review of the proposals, all three firms were invited for an interview to discuss in more detail each firm's project approach and schedule. The interviews were held earlier today. One firm, GGD Consulting Engineers, had to withdraw.

Based on the interviews, the Committee was in unanimous agreement to recommend that a contract be awarded to **Fitzemeyer & Tocci Associates Inc.** in the amount of **\$89,000**.

Fitzemeyer & Tocci presented examples of recent HVAC retrofit/renovation projects in Massachusetts K-12 schools on which they've worked that demonstrated their experience with a similar scope of work. They also demonstrated an understanding of the Town's goals for the project as well as their capability for maintaining an aggressive schedule for completion of design. They were confident that a construction start at the end of this current school year, if not earlier, was possible and had already explored options for achieving this schedule.

FY24 Snow Plow Contractors

As you are aware, the Town hires private contractors each year to assist with snow removal. Last year, the Town increased rates for new and returning contractors to remain competitive with the surrounding towns and MassDOT.

While there have not been storms with sufficient snowfall amounts where contractor were needed over the last several years, the Town must be prepared each year for the likelihood of a storm that does require the additional plowing provided by contractors. Therefore, to help guarantee that contractors continue to be available for the Town, I recommend that the Select Board approve a "signing bonus" in the amount of \$500. These funds would defray costs associated with plowing, such as insurance, plow edge, truck maintenance. The bonus would be payable March 1.

Dear Representative Viera:

On behalf of the Town of Mashpee Select Board, I hereby respectfully submit for your review and sponsorship a proposed draft Act authorizing the Town of Mashpee to lease certain Town owned land, notwithstanding the provisions of any general or special law to the contrary, to the Boys and Girls Club of Cape Cod, Inc. ("Club"). This petition was authorized by the unanimous vote of the Mashpee Town Meeting under Article 14 of the October 20, 2008 Annual Town Meeting. (See enclosed attested vote). A draft Act is also enclosed herewith for your review.

The purpose of the proposed Act is to authorize an additional long-term 99-year lease of Town owned land adjacent to the Boys and Girls Club facility located on Frank E. Hicks Drive in Mashpee. The General Court had previously enacted special legislation (Chapter 65 of the Acts of 1997) to enable the lease and development of said facility, which has been a valuable recreational, educational and cultural asset for the Mashpee community since its inception in 1995. The proposed Lease of additional Town owned land to the Club will allow for the expansion and improvement of Club facilities and programs to better serve the interests and needs of young Mashpee residents.

This proposed transaction has been authorized by a unanimous vote of the Mashpee Town Meeting and has the full support of the Select Board. For the reasons stated above, this land transfer will be advantageous for the Mashpee community and the Boys and Girls Club. The proposed lease will not negatively impact the interests of the Town because the subject land is presently vacant and not contemplated for other municipal use.

We look forward to working with you and your staff to secure the passage of this important special legislation. Thank you for your attention to this matter and please feel free to contact me if you have any questions.

An Act authorizing the Town of Mashpee to lease certain town land to the Boys and Girls Club of Cape Cod, Inc.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF MASHPEE TO LEASE CERTAIN TOWN OWNED LAND TO THE BOYS AND GIRLS CLUB OF CAPE COD, INC.

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or special law to the contrary, the Town of Mashpee, acting by and through its Select Board, is hereby authorized to lease to the Boys and Girls Club of Cape Cod, Inc. for a term of 99 years at a rent of \$1 per year and upon such other terms and conditions as said Board deems appropriate. Said parcel is shown on a plan entitled "Proposed Boys and Girls Club Expansion", dated September 8, 2008, approved by vote of the October 20, 2008 Mashpee Annual Town Meeting, a copy of which is on file in the office of the town clerk. Said Boys and Girls Club of Cape Cod, Inc. shall use said property, in conjunction with its existing adjacent facility, to provide educational, recreational and cultural services to persons under the age of 18 years individually, or in cooperation with other organizations, for the benefit of persons under the age of 18 years.

SECTION 2. In the event the parcel described in section 1 ceases to be used at any time during the lease term for the purposes specified herein, said parcel shall immediately revert to the care and control of the town of Mashpee.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon passage.

To see if the Town will vote to transfer the care, custody, management and control of the following parcel of Town owned land to the Select Board for the purpose of sale or lease in conjunction with use of the abutting Boys and Girls Club of Cape Cod, Inc. parcel: a portion of land shown on Assessors' map 67 as Block 1 and more particularly described on a plan entitled, "Proposed Boys and Girls Club Expansion", dated September 8, 2008, a copy of which is on file in the Office of the Town Clerk, and to authorize the Select Board to execute a deed or a lease therefor on such terms as the Select Board shall deem proper, and further, to authorize the Select Board to petition the General Court, as may be necessary, for special legislation authorizing such sale or lease, or take any other action relating thereto.
