Medicare Overview and Open Enrollment Presentation

Mashpee Senior Center will be hosting a Medicare overview and open enrollment presentation for Medicare beneficiaries, family members, caregivers, caseworkers and representatives. A guick review of your

coverage could save you money. Open enrollment is **October 15 - December 7**. Information regarding appointment times will be available soon.



A MESSAGE FROM THE REGIONAL SHINE OFFICE Barnstable County Department of Human Services)

MEDICARE'S OPEN ENROLLMENT IS HERE... Don't wait until it is too late! The Open Enrollment Period (Oct 15th – Dec 7th) for Medicare Advantage Plans (Part C) and Prescription Drug Plans (Part D) begins this month and it is very important to re-evaluate your Medicare options for 2023 during this period. Each year Medicare plans can change premiums, deductibles, co-pays and the prescription formulary (list of drugs they cover). In addition, Medicare Advantage Plans (HMOs, PPOs) often add and/or drop primary and specialty physicians, skilled nursing facilities and hospitals. Your current plan is required to notify you by September 30th of any changes for the coming year. If you decide to stay with your current plan, no further action is required. If you switch your Medicare Advantage Plan or Medicare Prescription Drug (Part D) Plan during the Open Enrollment Period, it will take effect January 1, 2023. (Please note - this enrollment period may not affect you if you have retiree coverage). SHINE appointments fill up quickly so don't forget to

call your senior center early. The Regional SHINE office is also available to help. If you would like the Regional SHINE office to assist you, please call 508-375-6762 for a telephone appointment. You may also contact Medicare at (800)-633-4227, they are available 24 hours, 7 days a week. This may also be the time of year where you have hit the gap or "donut hole" and your medication costs have increased. Fortunately, there are programs that may be able to assist with these costs. Please call the Regional SHINE office or make an appointment with a SHINE counselor at your local Senior Center to find out more about these assistance programs. Remember- don't wait until it is too late. If you don't make a change to your Medicare prescription plan during the Open Enrollment Period (Oct 15th- Dec 7th), you may have to stay with your existing plan for another year.

<u>Fuel Assistance Recertification - It's that time</u> <u>of year again.</u> If you receive fuel assistance, be prepared to recertify for the 2022-2023 season. You will

receive a letter and new application in the mail soon if you have not already. Every year you need to requalify for the next year. You will need to follow the same procedure. Fill



out the application and submit copies of the following documentation: (income, ID, utility bills, rent/mortgage, house insurance and real estate taxes) for all members living in the same household. Mashpee Council on Aging (COA) Minibus Service

To schedule a ride, call the Mashpee Senior Center at (508) 539-1440

The minibus operates on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays between the hours of 9:00 am – 1:30 pm. Trips can be scheduled to grocery stores, pharmacies, medical/dental appointments, the post office and the bank. (Ride requests for this service must be made a minimum of 48 hours in advance).

Trips for medical/dental appointments within the towns of Sandwich and Falmouth are also offered on a limited basis during the minibus operating days and hours. (Ride requests for this service must be made two weeks prior to your appointment date).

All passengers are required to wear a facial covering from the time of boarding until the time of exiting the bus.

To reserve your ride, call the Mashpee Senior Center at (508) 539-1440 and leave the following information: Your name, address, telephone number, along with the date, time and destination of your request. The driver will get back to you to inform you that your ride is confirmed.

Mashpee Senior Center is excited to Install an Automated Check-In System in starting soon!

A new, automated check-in system called MySeniorCenter will soon be installed in the foyer at Mashpee Senior Center. It's specifically designed to help our staff members manage the various sign-ups and sign-ins, and improve the way we report our services to the Town of Mashpee and Executive Office of Elder Affairs.

Moreover, by quickly and accurately detailing which services we're providing, the system will increase our chances of receiving additional funding in the future. Today MySeniorCenter is being used by over 1500 senior centers across the U.S. and Canada—so it's a proven tool.

A Change for the Better!

The new system is extremely easy to use. Here's how it works:

- 1. All visitors and volunteers will receive a small keytar. (The card contains no personal information, but it will allow the new system to recognize you.)
- 2. Instead of signing our activity log sheets, you'll swipe your keytag at the scanner, or you can enter your name on the touchscreen.
- 3. Press the touchscreen to select the programs you'll be participating in that day.
- 4. Press FINISH.

A Smooth Transition

Even though MySeniorCenter is designed to be user-friendly, Mashpee COA staff members and volunteers will be available in the foyer for the first couple of weeks to help people operate the new check-in system. We want to make the transition as seamless as possible for everyone.

To reiterate, once MySeniorCenter is running smoothly, our registration process will be more efficient and we'll stand a better chance of receiving funding for future activities.
