


Project Description

The proposed telecommunications facility will be located within a wooded area east of the existing fire station. The lease area for the facility is approximately 100-foot by 100-foot, and will contain a 150-foot tall monopole with an optional six-foot lightning rod for a total height of 156 feet. Associated telecommunications equipment will be located outside at the base of the structure within the fenced compound surrounded by a six-foot tall chain link fence with barbed wires, while a pad-mounted transformer will be located just outside the compound. The facility will be accessed via a 12-foot wide gravel driveway along a 20-foot wide access and utility easement, which will extend from the existing access road behind the fire station.

Ground Disturbance

Ground disturbance and tree clearing will be required for the planned telecommunications tower, associated equipment, fencing, and utilities.


FLOODPLAIN MAP



On July 28, 2017, a Professional Wetland Scientist (PWS) from Lucas Environmental, LLC (LE) completed a site investigation within a portion of the property located at 101 Red Brook Road in Mashpee, Massachusetts. The purpose of the site investigation was to identify and, if necessary, delineate regulated wetland resource areas within and immediately surrounding the subject parcels to inform the design and permitting of a proposed telecommunications facility. The site investigation was limited to wetland areas within 100 feet and perennial streams within 200 feet of the proposed telecommunications tower, ancillary access road, and infrastructure (i.e., Study Area).

This memo discusses jurisdictional wetlands and watercourses as well as other Resource Areas subject to protection at the local, state, and federal level. It also provides a brief analysis of local, state, and federal regulations which may impact the proposed design. The Lease Exhibit provided by ProTerra Design Group, dated June 8, 2017, was reviewed during development of this memorandum.

1.0 Existing Conditions

The proposed telecommunications facility is sited on a portion of a parcel located at 101 Red Brook Road in Mashpee, Massachusetts (Map 104, Lot 2). The property is an approximate 37-acre parcel which contains the Mashpee Fire Station (#2), parking lot, stormwater structures, and undeveloped woodlands. The woodlands can be characterized as a mixed oak-white pine forest. The tree canopy is vegetated with a mix of white pine (*Pinus strobus*), black oak (*Quercus velutina*), white oak (*Quercus alba*), and sassafras (*Sassafras albidum*). The shrub layer is densely vegetated with a mix of black huckleberry (*Gaylussacia baccata*), lowbush blueberry (*Vaccinium corymbosum*), and young growth of the overstory species. The herbaceous layer is vegetated with a mix of teaberry (*Gaultheria procumbens*), poison ivy (*Toxicodendron radicans*), sarsaparilla (*Aralia nudicaulis*), and bracken fern (*Pteridium aquilinum*).

The proposed telecommunications facility will be located within a wooded area east of the existing fire station. The lease area for the facility is approximately 70-foot by 70-foot, and will contain a 150-foot tall monopole with an optional six-foot lightning rod for a total height of 156 feet. Associated telecommunications equipment will be located outside at the base of the structure within the fenced compound surrounded by an eight-foot tall chain link fence with barbed wires, while a pad-mounted transformer will be located just outside the compound. The facility will be accessed via a 12-foot wide gravel driveway along a 20-foot wide access and utility easement, which will either extend from the existing parking lot or Red Brook Road.

2.0 Environmental Resource Areas

The wetland investigation was performed in accordance with the Massachusetts Wetlands Protection Act (WPA; M.G.L 131, Section 40) and implementing regulations (Regulations; 310 CMR 10.00 et seq.); the Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection (MassDEP) publication "Delineating Bordering Vegetated Wetlands Under the Massachusetts Wetlands Protection Act: A Handbook" (1995), the "Corps of Engineers' Wetlands Delineation Manual" (1987), the "Regional Supplement to the Corps of Engineers Wetland Delineation Manual: Northcentral and Northeast Region, v 2.0" (2012), and the Town of Mashpee Wetlands Protection Bylaw and Regulations (Chapter 172).

As a result of the wetland investigation, there are no local, state, or federally regulated wetland resource areas within 100 feet, or perennial streams within 200 feet of the Study Area.

3.0 Special Resources

A review of the current MassGIS data layer for the Massachusetts Natural Heritage Atlas (effective August 1, 2017) under the Natural Heritage & Endangered Species Program (NHESP) indicates that the Study Area is <u>not</u> located within Estimated Habitat of Rare Wildlife or Priority Habitat of Rare Species. It is noted that the site was previously identified as Estimated and Priority Habitat for Rare Species according to the October 1, 2008 edition of the Massachusetts Natural Heritage Atlas. Correspondence with NHESP confirms the site is not currently mapped as Priority or Estimated Habitat. No Certified or Potential Vernal Pools under the jurisdiction of the Wetlands Protection Act Regulations (310 CMR 10.00 et seq.) or the Massachusetts Endangered Species Act (321 CMR 10.00 et seq.) were observed within or near the Study Area.

According to the July 16, 2014 Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Flood Insurance Rate Map for Barnstable County, Massachusetts, Map Number 25001C0753J, the Study Area is located within Zone X which is classified as an area determined to be outside the 0.2% annual chance floodplain (500-year flood). Therefore, the Study Area is not located within the 100-year floodplain or Bordering Land Subject to Flooding.

The Study Area is not located within an Area of Critical Environmental Concern or within an Outstanding Resource Water. The Study Area is located within a MassDEP Approved Zone II Wellhead Protection Area.

4.0 Regulations

This section contains a brief description of the jurisdictional areas on and surrounding the site. Please note that this is not a comprehensive evaluation of all local, state, and federal permitting requirements; just those pertaining to wetland resource areas. It is important to note that flagged wetland and watercourse delineations are subject to change until verified by local, state, and/or federal regulatory agencies.



LE has not reviewed the proposed project requirements related to the Cape Cod Conservation Commission and understands that Blue Sky Towers is advancing that aspect of the permitting. LE can provide support as needed or requested.

According to the Massachusetts Wetlands Protection Act and its implementing regulations, if any portion of a proposed project is located within a regulated wetland resource area and/or its associated 100-Foot Buffer Zone, or within 200 feet of the Mean Annual High Water line of a perennial stream (Riverfront Area), a Request for Determination of Applicability (RDA) or Notice of Intent (NOI) must be filed with the Conservation Commission for permit approval prior to the commencement of work. The Town of Mashpee also regulates wetland resource areas under a Wetlands Protection Bylaw and associated Regulations; however, the proposed work is not located within jurisdiction of the Mashpee Conservation Commission, therefore further discussion is not warranted. The Lease Exhibit provided to LE indicates that work is not located within jurisdictional resource areas or buffer zones, and will therefore not require a permit from the Conservation Commission.

A wetland that is connected to a Water of the United States is jurisdictional under Section 404 of the Clean Water Act. Generally if a wetland area is connected to, adjacent to, or in the very near vicinity of a Water of the U.S., then it is likely going to be considered connected and subject to the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) jurisdiction. The Lease Exhibit provided to LE indicates that work is not located within federal jurisdictional resource areas and will therefore not require a permit from the USACE.
