arine and road flares can be a problem to dispose of when outdated or no longer needed. Since flares are not accepted at household hazardous products collections and should not be thrown in household trash, what is the best method of disposal?

Residents of all Cape Cod towns can make arrangements to dispose of marine and boat flares through town fire departments, departments of public works or recycling centers. *Only hand-held marine and road flares will be accepted.* Smoke flares and launched flares cannot be accepted. A list of collection locations is on the back of this sheet.

By Federal law, each recreational boat 16 feet and over must carry Visual Distress Signals (VDS). Currently, the only United States Coast Guard (USCG) approved VDS are pyrotechnic flares. All flares must have a clearly marked



expiration date, which is 42 months past the date of manufacture. Recreational boaters are required to have a minimum of three "in-date" flares on board. Therefore, every three years, boaters must purchase new flares to replace their out-of-date flares.

It is against the law to set off flares in a "non-emergency situation" (unless special arrangements are made with the USCG and local fire department). Some boaters opt to keep their out-of-date flares on board for emergencies.

With an estimated 250,000 out-of date flares generated annually in Massachusetts by boaters, it is essential that flares be safely disposed of at town collection locations.
